

Uday by HCLFoundation

UdaybyHCLFoundation, success, drawn from the 'convergence' model where NGOs, duty bearers, communities and HCLFoundation come together and work towards integrated community development. This programme is now in scaling up phase in all cities, where HCL has a presence.

India has the world's largest youth population, with 354.4 million people aged between 15 and 29 years (India Labor Market Update, 2016, International Labor Organization – ILO). Despite the economic growth and an increase in general education levels, youth unemployment is a growing challenge, especially among the urban educated youth. Many families/ youth migrating from the rural areas end up living in slum areas (low-income housing) and youth from these households lack access to the resources and opportunities to make a foray into formal sector employment.

The goal of "Skill Development & Livelihoods" portfolio is to empower youth so that they are able to break the cycle of poverty and lead a life of dignity. The portfolio is further bifurcated in the following three sub-themes-

Skill Development & Livelihoods Thematic Objectives

- Yuvakendras & Career Counselling: Skill Development Centers help in reducing the gap between demand and supply of skilled work force by providing training in skill development and skill upgradation. The Yuvakendras enhance the vocational skills of youth, by imparting placement-linked and market-oriented skill training with suitable wage/ selfemployment opportunities. Providing quality career guidance to School/ College students coupled with technical training to open their horizon to various career choices and make them placement ready.
- Women Empowerment & Incubation of Social Enterprises/ Micro Entrepreneurs: Marginalized sections have a strong desire and capability to break the cycle of poverty. Social mobilization, building institutions and providing alternative income generation opportunities are critical. Facilitation of knowledge, handholding, skill building, access to credit, access to forward and backward market linkages, awareness of rights and entitlements and access to livelihood services stimulate this upward mobility. Facilitating, handholding and nurturing young women and men. Undertaking capacity building, providing seed money and working closely to bring about long term sustainable solutions.
- Collaborating with Government Institutions: Information deficit among school and college goers is common and is further magnified in Government institutional setup. This information asymmetry hinders them from effectively participating in the workforce. Providing career guidance and counselling to students of public schools will prove to be critical for their progress and development. Similarly, strengthening of Government institutions in the vocational space is also the need of the hour. The focus will be on providing resources to existing Government Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs), Polytechnics and Government Institutions which will revamp quality education and improved learning experience.

Under the leadership of the Director, HCLFoundation, the assigned personnel will be responsible for planning, strategizing and monitoring of various projects related to Skill Development & Livelihoods theme under HCLFoundation's urban flagship Programme – ' Uday by HCLFoundation' across locations. The incumbent will be responsible for coordinating and implementation of projects and provide technical inputs in developing, reviewing and adding value to the strategies.

The position will be responsible for:

- Strategy: Structuring livelihood projects of HCLFoundation centred around joborientated skill development, self-employment and entrepreneurship in accordance with the established HCL Uday's Livelihood Framework, and in alignment with National/ State Government policy guidelines and UN SDGs.
- Identification of new, innovative and relevant trades and industries for the skilling programs across locations.
- Grant Management: Ensuring effective execution of project activities by closely working with NGO partners both on programmatic as well as financial fronts.
- Regular monitoring and field visit of project sites under Skill Development & Livelihood theme in select HCL Uday cities.
- Setup clear mechanisms for beneficiary follow-up and documentation of the same.
- Manage and plan effective use of resources in order to comply with the audit requirements.
- Effective engagement of HCL employees across Skill Development & Livelihood projects through creative and engaging strategies (employee volunteering).
- Networking with the concerned local and Government authorities and ensuring that the projects are in sync with the larger policy framework so as to leverage their support.
- Maintaining database of NGOs across UdaybyHCLFoundation project areas and exploring synergies with relevant stakeholders (prospective NGO partners, State/ National Government departments/ agencies, Academic Institutions etc.).
- Skilled in documentation and handling the partner organization for effective implementation through convergence mechanism and strategies impact based models with partners.
- Research and identify potential donors and funding sources
- Develop and implement fundraising strategies/ fundraising pitch deck to raise funds for the organization
- Build and maintain strong relationships with donors, sponsors, and funding agencies
- Write grant proposals and manage the grant application process
- Networking with potential donors
- Collaborate with other team members to ensure the success of fundraising efforts
